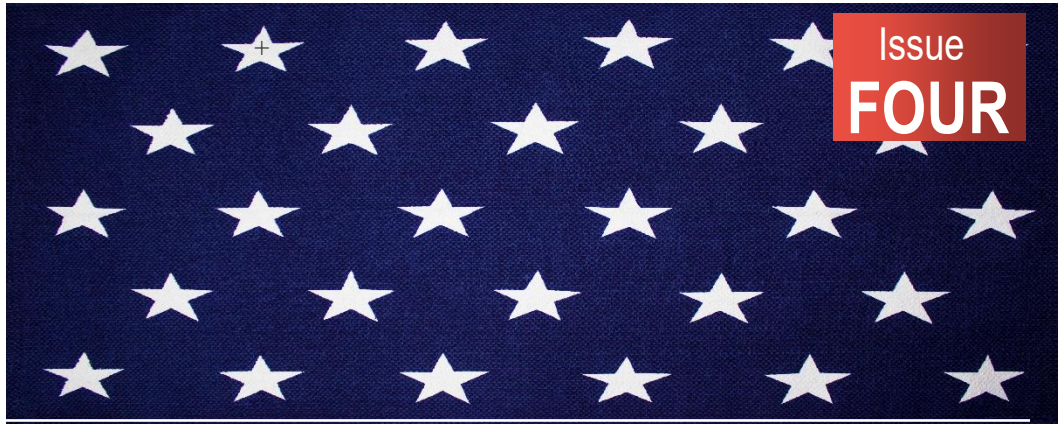

PAYMENT OPTIONS

OPTION 1-Independent Bank (CHARLOTTE BRANCH ONLY) accepts payments during bank hours from 7/1/2025 through 9/14/2025. You must present the original tax bill (green). The bank will provide you a receipt of payment.

OPTION 2-Mail your taxes to Walton Township at PO Box 306, Olivet MI 49076

OPTION 3- In Person payment can be made during the following office hours: Monday, July 14th 8am-12pm, Monday, August 11th 8am-12pm and Saturday, September 13th 8am-12pm

To reduce mailing and postage costs, receipts will no longer be sent. If a receipt is requested, please provide a self-addressed stamped envelope or an email address.

REMINDER

Olivet Fire Department recently took delivery of their new tanker. Their apparatus features a Spencer aluminum body riding on a Freightliner 108SD chassis. A Cummins L9 400HP diesel provides the twist to the Hale Qmax-XS 1500GPM pump which keeps the water flowing from the 3000-gallon poly tank. R-O-M roll-up compartment doors keep the elements out while lighting systems from SoundOff Signal manage visibility.



The new iPhone crash detection feature, while intended to aid in emergency situations, is causing an increase in false 911 calls, leading to resource strain for police and fire departments. These false calls often stem from unintentional events like a phone falling from a car roof or a baseball hitting a phone in a pocket.

While not suggesting users disable the feature, police and fire departments are urging awareness among iPhone users about how the crash detection works and how to prevent false triggers. This includes securing phones in vehicles and being mindful of potential triggers like sudden stops or impacts.
